

*2016 ACCOMPLISHMENTS *

657 young people participated in Learning Web Programs in 2016

Youth Exploration Program

338 Middle and high school youth learned more about themselves and the possibilities for future education, careers, and hobbies.

97% of the youth joining us on exploration tours increasing their knowledge of specific duties, training and qualifications of chosen fields of interest and clarified career interests.

92% of youth apprentices reported that their apprentice increased their knowledge of the field of work and influenced their future career plans.

94% of youth participating in 28 community service projects developed planning, decisionmaking, leadership and teamwork skills and a committment to address community needs.

youth living in foster care homes developed the aptitudes and skills needed to finish their education and secure a satisfying job that provides for a self-sufficient lifestyle.

Youth Outreach Program

Homeless youth participated in outreach activities and the independent living program leading them to increased stability, safe housing, gains in educational and employment goals, and skills for living independently.

76% of youth in independent lying program have secured stable safe hosuing and have maintained it for 3-6 months.

of youth who entered Youth Outreach as high school dropouts had reengaged with school by discharge or year end.

of youth who were unemployed upon program entry were employed at discharge or year end. The rate of youth employed full time increased by 21%.

3 youth became self-sufficient at discharge or year end. These youth are now able to provide for their needs without any outside assistance.
